*Crosstabulation Results*

*Methodology:*

This poll was conducted between May 22-May 24, 2026 among a sample of 2002 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on gender by age, gender by children in household, race by educational attainment, educational attainment, marital status, home ownership, region, 2024 presidential vote, and race. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
